Hailed as an American masterpiece of architecture and design in 1928, the Los Angeles City Hall remains one of the most admired buildings in the United States. To preserve the city's civic heritage, Project Restore pursued the monumental task of restoring the Los Angeles City Hall to its original splendor, including restorative illumination of the façade.

Horton Lees Brogden reinterpreted the original façade lighting to maintain the unique historic character of the structure. Utilizing modern technologies— energy efficient luminaires that incorporate long-life lamps— the updated lighting provides a modern equivalent to the original plan consuming one third of the power. Balancing light levels to compensate for the higher ambient light inherent in a present day metropolis allows the building to regain its prominence on the skyline.
